What progress have states made in the last year to increase access to group prenatal care?

Alabama	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Alabama, group prenatal care services were available at three CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, legislators introduced H.B. 598, known as the Rural Maternal and Infant Health Equity Act which would, among other provisions, provide funding to local maternal health partnerships providing group prenatal care and other maternal health services. The bill did not pass this session.
Alaska	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update Alaska did not have any CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, and we are unaware of any other group prenatal care models in the state. In the last year, Alaska did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Arizona	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2024, Arizona began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate of \$45 per patient, per visit. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Arizona, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. In the last year, Arizona did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Arkansas	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Arkansas, group prenatal care services were available at three CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Arkansas did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

No State Context and Policy Update In California, group prenatal care services were available at 55 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, which is the largest number of sites across states. California also recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. Previously, California offered an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care of \$11.24 per hour, per patient. The enhanced rate was removed from the California Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program in 2025. In the last year, California did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

No State Context and Policy Update In Florida, group prenatal care services were available at seven CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Florida did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

No State Context and Policy Update In Georgia, group prenatal care services were available at six CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Georgia did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings. One managed care organization (MCO) in Georgia, CareSource, offered an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care of \$30 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits) in 2025, but the rate is not included in CareSource resources as of September 2026.

No State Context and Policy Update In Hawaii, group prenatal care services were available at three CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Hawaii did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

In the last year, Kansas did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Kentucky	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Kentucky, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. In the last year, Kentucky did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Louisiana	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Louisiana, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. In the last year, Louisiana did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings. One managed care organization (MCO) in Louisiana, HealthyBlue LA (formerly known as Amerigroup), offered an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care of \$50 per patient, per visit, but the rate is not included in Healthy Blue LA resources as of September 2026. Previously, according to an assessment of the state's program by the Centering Healthcare Institute, many providers may not have used the enhanced Medicaid reimbursement billing code because they were unaware the code existed and only one MCO was available for billing.
Maine	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Maine, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. Maine also recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. Expanding access to group prenatal care is listed as a priority of Maine's Transforming Maternal Health (TMaH) Model. In the last year, Maine did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

Maryland	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2022, Maryland began offering an enhanced rate for group prenatal care of an additional \$50 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits) for care delivered through the CenteringPregnancy model. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Maryland, group prenatal care services were available at 17 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. The Maryland Department of Health previously provided grant funding to expand CenteringPregnancy sites in the state beginning in 2023. The grant cycle ended in 2026. In the last year, Maryland did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Massachusetts	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Massachusetts, group prenatal care services were available at eight CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Massachusetts did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Michigan	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2024, Michigan began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate of \$45 per patient, per visit (up to 12 visits). One of the 12 group visits may occur during the postpartum period. The enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate is inclusive of services provided at Federally Qualified Health Centers. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? Yes. Michigan offers state or payor grants for CenteringPregnancy models. State Context and Policy Update In Michigan, group prenatal care services were available at 40 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, the second highest number of sites across states. In the last year, legislators enacted S.B. 415, which will codify Medicaid reimbursement for group prenatal care, and appropriated \$5 million for grants to CenteringPregnancy. Legislators also introduced H.B. 4703, which would require all insurers in the state to cover and reimburse group prenatal care. As of September 2026, the bill had not passed.

Minnesota	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Minnesota, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. In the last year, Minnesota did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Mississippi	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update Mississippi did not have any CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, and we are unaware of any other group prenatal care models in the state. In the last year, legislators introduced H.B. 1493, also known as the Mississippi Maternal Health Omnibus Act, which would have directed the Department of Health to provide group prenatal and postpartum care either in-person or virtually beginning in July 2027. The program would have been available for women who qualify for WIC and would have provided five prenatal and five postpartum visits free of charge. The bill did not pass this session.
Missouri	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2023, Missouri HealthNet Division began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement of \$40 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits). The enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate is inclusive of services provided at Federally Qualified Health Centers. Reimbursement is available for CenteringPregnancy, March of Dimes, and EleVATE group prenatal care models. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Missouri, group prenatal care services were available at two CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Missouri did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

Montana	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2017, Montana began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement of \$30 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits). The enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate is inclusive of services provided at Federally Qualified Health Centers. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update Despite having an enhanced reimbursement rate, Montana did not have any CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, and we are unaware of any other group prenatal care models in the state. Montana recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. Montana did not hold a regular legislative session this year.
Nebraska	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Nebraska, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. Nebraska also recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. In the last year, Nebraska did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

No State Context and Policy Update In New Hampshire, group prenatal care services were available at two CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, New Hampshire did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

New Jersey	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2019, legislators expanded the state's Medicaid program to cover group prenatal care services at an enhanced rate of an additional \$7 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits). This rate is substantially lower than other states' enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No. State Context and Policy Update In New Jersey, group prenatal care services were available at 23 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. New Jersey also recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. In the last year, New Jersey did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
New Mexico	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In New Mexico, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. In the last year, New Mexico did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

Evidence-based group prenatal care is recognized as an intervention to increase access to prenatal care in the 2025-2030 Prevention Agenda. In the last year, New York did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

North Carolina	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2023, North Carolina began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement of \$250 per group, after patients attend five or more visits. The enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate is inclusive of services provided at Federally Qualified Health Centers. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In North Carolina, group prenatal care services were available at 23 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In 2020, North Carolina recognized group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal health and the Department of Health and Human Services recommended that payors develop policies to encourage the use of group prenatal care. In the last year, North Carolina did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
North Dakota	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In North Dakota, group prenatal care services were available at one CenteringPregnancy site in 2026. North Dakota did not hold a regular legislative session this year.
Ohio	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2021, Ohio began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care of \$45 per patient, per visit, (up to six visits). Additional group pregnancy education without a care component can be billed for up to 12 visits. The enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate is inclusive of services provided at Federally Qualified Health Centers. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Ohio, group prenatal care services were available at 35 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, the third highest number of sites across states. In the last year, Ohio did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Oklahoma	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Oklahoma, group prenatal care services were available at two CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Oklahoma did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

Oregon	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In Oregon, group prenatal care services were available at 10 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In 2016, South Carolina began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care using the CenteringPregnancy model of \$30 per visit, per patient (up to 10 visits). There is also an additional one-time retention reimbursement on or after the fifth visit of \$175 per patient available through two managed care organizations (MCOs), Healthy Blue and Blue Cross Blue Shield. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update In South Carolina, group prenatal care services were available at 16 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, South Carolina did not take additional legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

South Dakota	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? No State Context and Policy Update South Dakota did not have any CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, and we are unaware of any other group prenatal care models in the state. In the last year, South Dakota did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
Tennessee	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? No Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? In 2015, Texas began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate for group prenatal care of \$42.27 per patient, per visit (up to 10 visits). Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? Yes. Texas offers state or payor grants for CenteringPregnancy models. State Context and Policy Update In Texas, group prenatal care services were available at 33 CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. Texas did not hold a regular legislative session this year.
Utah	Does the state offer an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate to incentivize group prenatal care? Yes. In 2025, Utah began offering an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate of \$20 per patient, per visit (up to eight visits). Previously, the state offered an enhanced Medicaid reimbursement rate of \$9.92 per patient, per visit. However, according to an assessment of the state's program by the Centering Healthcare Institute, the reimbursement rate does not cover the full clinical scope of services included in the CenteringPregnancy curriculum. Additionally, providers may not be using the enhanced Medicaid reimbursement billing code because they are unaware that the code exists. Does the state invest funding to pilot or scale up group prenatal care in the state? Yes. In the last year, Utah began offering state or payor grants for CenteringPregnancy models. State Context and Policy Update In Utah, group prenatal care services were available at four CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026. In the last year, Utah did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.

No State Context and Policy Update Wisconsin did not have any CenteringPregnancy sites in 2026, and we are unaware of any other group prenatal care models in the state. Wisconsin does, however, recognizes group prenatal care as an effective strategy to improve maternal and child health outcomes. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services promotes the CenteringPregnancy model in the state's Healthy Births initiative. In the last year, Wisconsin did not take any legislative or regulatory action to enhance its group prenatal care offerings.
